- II. Approval of the minutes
 - A. Approval of minutes tabled to next meeting
- III. Approval of the agenda
 - A. Agenda is approved 10-0-0
- IV. Public Comments
 - A. Add Lt. Kilgore to public comment
 - 1. Discusses the need for USAC members to assist with the regular of motorized scooters on campus
 - 2. Discusses "block party" at UC Riverside
 - 3. Says that UCPD needs to be more involved in student events, encourages USAC to invite UCPD to said events

 - 1. Fieldman reads the position description
 - 2. Alex Lim delivers opening statement
 - a) CSC asks Lim to define what service is to him
 - (1) Providing things to people that they might not have access to. Helping people get back on their feet.
 - b) CEC asks Lim how he will manage his time commitments
 - (1) He will be able to complete all the tasks required in a timely manner
 - c) CSC asks Lim what his knowledge is of other service organizations not affiliated with healthcare
 - (1) Discusses his involvement outside of healthcare educational outreach programs in science

- d) Lim is asked what goals he has while working on the committee
 - (1) His main goal is to enhance communication between UCLA community service organizations and the Mini Fund Committee
 - (a) In addition to allocations, would like to inform organizations of Mini Fund recommendations
 - (b) Talk with each project regarding status and how projects can be approved
- e) Lim is asked how he will reach out to non-affiliated and less established organizations
 - (1) Lim replies that he is still working on that and needs to consult his SOLE advisor
- f) Lim is asked why he ran for the application he is applying for
 - (1) Lim replies that service is the defining characteristic of his time at UCLA, gained experience in working with people, wants to give back, knows how important the Mini Funds are
- g) Lim is asked what he hopes to gain from this experience
 - (1) Lim replies that he would like to gain experience with the funding/proposal process and project reviewing, wants to see what projects do well and apply that to the future
 - (2) Lim explains his dedication to community service
- h) Lim gives his closing statement
 - (1) Very dedicated to community service and the CS Mini Fund, wants to focus on increasing communication between the committee and organizations, thank you for your time
